STATEMENT ON RE-ASSESSMENT OF ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMMES

The National Council for Higher Education (NCHE) accredits academic or professional programmes as per its mandate, based on a prescribed set of Quality Assurance capacity indicators specified in the Quality Assurance Regulatory Framework. These indicators include infrastructure and human resources available for implementing a programme. The NCHE, in addition, assesses the quality and relevance of the programme and its learning outcomes as well as the teaching and learning methods. Institutions are required to re-submit programs for reassessment every 5 years (for Masters, Bachelors, Diplomas and Higher Education Certificates) and every 10 years for PhDs.

The NCHE re-assesses the programmes to establish, among other things:

- 1. The implementation of NCHE regulations regarding minimum standards;
- 2. The adherence to the programme design, the content, the duration, contact hours and assessment of what is taught;
- 3. Relevance of what is taught for the job market and the nation;
- 4. The quality of graduates.

Expiry of accreditation means that the programme needs re-assessment to establish whether the key aspects upon which accreditation was granted are still in place.
